Looking Glass FoundationTM was co-founded in 2002 by three families seeking care for their loved ones, who were suffering from life-threatening eating disorders. With commitment and courage, these families established Canada's first eating disorder live-in treatment program for youth, which is now operated in collaboration with the Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA).

Looking Glass Foundation also offers three peer support programs: Online Peer Support (virtual), Personal Recovery Space (virtual), and Hand in Hand (hybrid). These programs are facilitated by trained and supported volunteers. In 2021, a new program was established - Looking Glass Counselling | Bridge the GapTM. This program offers affordable one-to-one therapeutic support to individuals who are affected by eating disorders and provides a meaningful learning experience for students in the field of counselling. The Foundation also has a scholarship program, and Foundation board and staff provide in-person, telephone, and email support to hundreds of people each year.

The Executive Director advances the organization's strategic direction and oversees financial sustainability, fund development, programs, and operational management.
