You will collaborate with a wide network of partners and stakeholders including all levels of government and industry associations to enhance labour market analysis and lead workforce development initiatives, reduce reliance on scarce resources (e.g. temporary foreign workers and domestic farm workers), and improve the resilience of agriculture and food businesses in BC.

Qualifications for this role include:

Recent related experience must include a minimum of 3-5 years of experience (as above) in each of the following:

- Experience conducting public sector policy analysis and development.
- Experience conducting consultations with industry associations and other levels of government.
- Experience providing advice and recommendations to senior decision-makers.
- Experience working collaboratively across organizations to advance the resolution of highprofile and sensitive policy issues.
